Position	Candidates (page # in VP)	Notes
Pos. 1	Jordan Rooklyn (15-16) Ann Gaffney (15-16)	Both Jordan and Ann have received endorsements from the Jackson County Democrats. We believe either would be a good choice.
Pos. 3	Noelle Christensen (15-17) Deltra Ferguson (15-17) Susanne McGraw (15-18)	Same thing here with Noelle and Deltra. Both are acceptable candidates.
Pos. 4	Rebecca Dyson <i>Incumbent</i> (15-19) Alex Sol (not in Voter Pamphlet) Grant Jolliffe (15-18) Elisa Hawksley (15-19)	Rebecca and Grant have received the endorsement of the Jackson County Democrats. The party recommends either one.

Jackson Co. Rural Fire Protection District 5 (rural Ashland) Positions 2, 3, 4, and 5 are on this year's ballot. We have endorsed [Eleanor Ponomareff](#) for Pos. 4. We have taken no position on the other races.

Rogue Community College Board of Education Ashland is in Zone 5, which is not on the ballot this year.

Rogue Valley Transportation District You will be voting for Positions 4, 5, 6, and 7. All are one-person races except Pos. 5, where we have endorsed [Katrina Ehrnman-Newton](#). We have no objections to the candidates who are running in the other races.

Southern Oregon Education Service District Zone 5 – Ariel Bloomer is running unopposed. We have taken no position.
